## 4. SOUTH SUMMIT FIRE DISTRICT: Scott Thorell, South Summit Fire Chief

Mr. Thorell introduced himself to the Council as the newly appointed Fire Chief for the South Summit Fire District. He updated the Council on the changes within the District and the additional responsibilities that will now reside with the district for emergency services. Informed the Council that even though Wasatch County is not included in the updated interlocal agreement they have agreed to be a third case back up for emergency services. He discussed how the district is organized i.e., board, employees, and volunteers and believes they will be able to serve the community better.

Councilmember Smart asked about the tax increase and whether the district believes they will have the resources that are needed to support the community. Chief Thorell mentioned that for now the tax increase is what needed to be done and was appreciative of the public's support. Councilmember Smart followed up with a question regarding the recent election and how the commissioners and chief are organized. Chief Thorell stated that there are three commissioners, and those commissioners are elected offices. They are the governing body of the district.

Mayor Woolstenhulme thanked him for coming as did various Councilmembers.

## 5. ETHICS STATEMENT

Mayor Woolstenhulme discussed the Ethics Statement that had been sent out to each member of the Council. He reviewed the purpose of the Municipal Officer's and Employees Act. If the Council agreed with the statement, he asked them to sign the statement and informed them it would be held in the recorder's office.

 Mayor Woolstenhulme called the Council's attention to the document in their folders and in front of them that indicated the current Councilmember assignments.
