DARK SKY ORDINANCE



"I step from my porch and see the vast darkness above. The first stars are just beginning to show. A crisp Weber Canyon breeze hits my face..."

Wow...Sorry! I was caught in a moment. How do we protect Oakley's dark skies? With the adoption of a new land use code in 2021, Oakley City created a Dark Sky ordinance to protect our skies and minimize light pollution. Full cutoff light fixtures (think downward emitting light) and bulb color and brightness are all part of the solution. As of **May 2026** (I know it seems far away,) all lighting must comply with ordinance, so begin now to do your part to preserve our beautiful night sky and make Oakley a designated Dark Sky Community.

WATER UPDATE



On December 14, 2022, the Oakley City Council awarded the drilling contract for the new well to Lang Equipment/Drilling Co. We are excited to be working with Lang and feel confident that they are the right outfit for the technical nature of our wellsite. Lang expects to be mobilizing onsite in late Spring of 2023. 1. Go to: <https://www.utah.gov/pmnl/>
2. On right side of page, click on "Search"
3. Enter **Oakley** in the *Entity Name* and hit Submit.
4. Scroll down and you will see the notices from Oakley City.
5. Click on a notice from one of the "Public Bodies." * Oakley City has 3 public bodies - Oakley City Council, Oakley Planning Commission, and Oakley Rodeo Committee.
6. Once you are seeing the notice, at the bottom, you will see a "Subscribe by Email" section. Fill in your information to receive notices from **that** public body.
7. **NOTE** - you will need to repeat steps 5 and 6 for each of the public bodies that you wish to subscribe to.
